



Personal, Social and Emotional Development (PSED)

Learning objectives:

- ◆ Attends to and takes account of what others say.
- ◆ Can describe self in positive terms and talk about abilities.
- ◆ Talk about how they and others show feelings.
- ◆ Talk about their own and others' behaviour and its consequences. Understands that their own actions affect other people.

Communication and language (CL)

Learning objectives:

- ◆ Joins in with repeated refrains and anticipates key events and phrases in stories.
- ◆ They respond to what they hear in stories with relevant comments, questions or actions.
- ◆ Beginning to understand questions.
- ◆ Use talk to organise, sequence and clarify thinking.
- ◆ Use past, present and future tense accurately when talking about events that have happened or are to happen in the future.

Physical Development (PD)

Learning objectives:

- ◆ Holds pencil near point between first two fingers and thumb and uses it with good control.
 - ◆ Knows the importance of good health and can talk about ways to keep healthy.
 - ◆ Increased control when pushing, patting, throwing and catching.
 - ◆ Experiment with moving in different ways.
 - ◆ Shows understanding of the need for safety when tackling new challenges, and manages some risks.
- Daily physical development sessions will support the PD activities across the indoor and outdoor areas of our classroom.

Characteristics of Effective Learning:

- ❖ Playing and Exploring – engagement.
- ❖ Active Learning – motivation.
- ❖ Creating and Thinking Critically – thinking.

Literacy

Learning objectives:

- ◆ Can segment the sounds in CVC/CVCC words and blend them together.
- ◆ Naming and sounding the letters of the alphabet.
- ◆ Read some common irregular words.
- ◆ Uses some clearly identifiable letters to communicate meaning, representing some sounds in sequence.
- ◆ Knows that information can be retrieved from books and computers.
- ◆ Attempts to write short sentences in context.
- ◆ Write a different part of a story.

Talk for writing: We will continue to develop the children's talk for writing skills through the use of patterned and repetitive texts to imitate and innovate. This will also include some story writing.

Phonics: We will continue to follow the 'Letters and sounds' programme using jolly phonics actions to support this. Sound cards will be sent home with reading books.

Mathematics

Learning objectives:

- ◆ Count on and back from 0 – 20 and beyond.
- ◆ Can say 1 more or 1 less than a given number.
- ◆ Can add two 1 digit numbers together.
- ◆ Can subtract two 1 digit numbers.
- ◆ Floating and sinking – capacity.
- ◆ Measuring – length.

Understanding of the world

Learning objectives:

- ◆ Enjoys joining in with family customs and routines.
- ◆ Looks closely at similarities, differences, patterns and change.
- ◆ Talk about how environments might vary from one another.
- ◆ Make observations of animals and plants and explain why some things occur, and talk about changes.
- ◆ Show care and concern for living things.

Expressive Arts and Design (EAD)

Learning objectives:

- ◆ Explores the different sounds of instruments.
- ◆ Explores what happens when they mix colours.
- ◆ Use simple tools to effect changes.
- ◆ Manipulates materials to achieve a planned effect.
